At the late afternoon Board meeting, several women from the Daughters of the American Revolution made a presentation about a Pike County flag used in the Civil War that was recently found and is in need of restoration. The 34 star flag is unique, in that it has the battles in which it was used written on the stripes and also the names of those who perished in the battles. These names were written on the flag almost 150 years ago! This newly discovered flag is a remarkable piece of Pike County's history. \$7000 is needed to restore the flag, place it in a glass case and have it on permanent display in the Pike

County Courthouse. Without hesitation, the TRJC Board of Directors voted to direct the proceeds from the 2005 Safari raffle sales for this purpose and, in addition, advance the \$3500 to the DAR so restoration may begin immediately. I wish you could have all seen the look on the lady's faces when this was announced. Board Member Tim Miller presented the check.



After an excellent dinner put on by the VFW, the auction began. This auction, as in past years, was to help raise funds for the Mounted Angels. Michelle Westmass brought in an exhibit and spoke about the great things their organization does for physically challenged kids. Then the fun began. At one point O.R. and Michelle were bidding on a red Jeep wagon. O.R. didn't realize he was bidding against Michelle. When the bidding was done and OR found whom he was bidding against, he donated the wagon to Michelle for her child.



Over \$800 was raised and TRJC added the balance to make a \$1000 donation to Mounted Angels. Thanks to all of you who attended. What a great day, in less than 2 hours TRJC donated \$4500 to the community that welcomes us Jeepers to wheel on their lands!

## Coming to the Aid of a Landowner

December 2004 brought a heavy and wet snow storm to Pike County, Illinois. To most folks in the area it meant slick roads, ice covered windows and a hope in young folks minds of school closings. However, to TRJC landowner, Rick and Sharon Wombles, it meant a possible huge loss to their hunting club business as over 10,000 pheasant, quail and red leg partridge birds escaped or were injured as their pens collapsed because of the weight of the snow.

There was no time to be wasted if a portion of the birds were to be recaptured and saved. Approximately 6 acres of bird pens had to be rebuilt. Phone calls were made looking for anyone to help. Rick's brother Tom made a few calls. One call ended up being a large reason to the success of rescuing at least 80% of the birds' lives.

TRJC members, Mark Kinne (Reckless) along with his son Shane drove from Quincy, Illinois to participate in the rescue efforts. In extreme cold temperatures and wet snow, they aided in capturing many of birds and repaired the pens. Their efforts continued late into the evening. The Wombles' family is extremely grateful to the Kinne's. As Tom and I have gotten to spend a lot more time with Mark and Shane over the past couple of years', we've come to know them as hard working, respectful people that we enjoy spending time with. TRJC can be very proud of the representation that they get from Mark and Shane.


# Trail of Life

BRRRR, it is definitely winter in central Illinois. Not much snow, but a lot of cold air to make you shiver. I have especially noticed it about three o'clock in the morning when most sane people are in a warm bed, but we are out enjoying the night air dropping newspaper bundles. It also seems the firehouse business picks up in the frigid weather.

I have received a only a few items to include in the Trail of Life column this issue Dave may add a few items, but I do have another true story to share.

The week before Christmas our family was hit with a some challenges. My 33 year old nephew had a heart attack requiring double by-pass surgery setting a record for the youngest person to undergo that operation in Springfield, (he's doing fine). Next, my seven year old great niece was diagnosed with leukemia and though very treatable, must be in St. Jude's in Memphis through February. Then to fill out the "it comes in threes" phenomenon, my 89 year old mom got dragged behind a car.



Now let me give you some background. My mom has been going Jeepin' with me for almost ten years. In all that time my worry wart older sisters are always telling me she will hurt herself and I shouldn't ask her to go, she is too old to do such things. Yeah, tell her that. Mom realizes she can't go all the time, and I understand her disappointment the times when I don't take her. But she always lets me know she would have liked to go.

Well anyway, she went with my sister and her husband to a school band concert for the holidays While getting out of the car, the belt on her coat got shut in the car door. Upon hearing the door slam, my brother-in-law takes off to go park the car, towing mom along the ground for about ten feet. Upon hearing all the yelling, he quickly stopped, nearly in shock himself. Trooper that mom is, she sprung up and denied any injury, and insisted on attending the concert. I was not advised of the incident for a couple of days when mom decided maybe she should see a doctor as she was not feeling up to par. After asking what she thought was wrong, I got the full story.

I remember getting in real trouble for not telling her things that had happened to me like that when I was growing up. She felt like she should have healed in a day or two and that just wasn't happening. Well the doctor found she had a fracture in her l-1 vertebrae. She would have to undergo a procedure where they inject cement into the fracture and then it is as good as new. Praise God, it was a success and she is up and about, no worse for the wear.

Now, I am really raising a stink with my sisters. I have never bounced mom out of the Jeep, never rolled her over in the Jeep, and definitely never dragged her behind the Jeep. So now my sisters are pretty quite when we talk about going Jeepin' this year. I have put a ban on all concerts and other such high culture, so called "safe events." Mom would rather get dirty and run the trails than sit through a concert anyway.

Well, that's my story, and like all the others, it's the truth.


